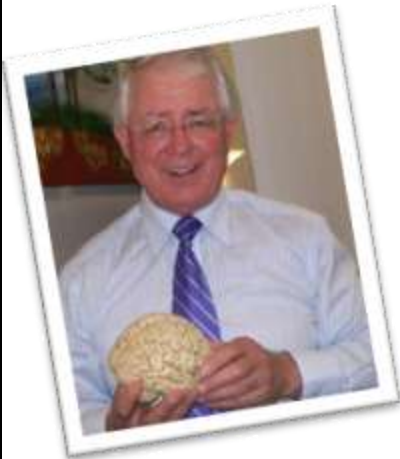


Auckland Diversional Therapy Support Groups
